## **Building Connections with Communities in your Orchestra Program and Beyond!**

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
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Many students participate in school music ensembles as a way to build social connections with friends in school. This desire to be a part of a community in school is linked to research surrounding adolescent development of self-identity within the music classroom (Abril, 2012). The identity transformation that adolescents achieve through experiences, like shared music, provides them with the strategies to develop healthy concepts of themselves and connections with others (Campbell, Connell & Beegle, 2007).

We know that these communities are unique and intersect in distinctive ways.
